Biometric is mandatory for attendance maintenance and payroll process. If anyone is falling to punch in the bio matric they should produce the proper supporting documents.

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

RULES OF CONDUCT FOR NON - TEACHING STAFF MEMBERS

- 1.Non teaching staff members should report to duty on their working time.
- 2. Biometric attendance and signing in attendance register on arrival and departure are compulsory.
- 3. ID Card must be worn by all staffs.
- 4. The non teaching staff members expected to be courteous and well behaved with all faculties, parents and students.
- 5. Staff members should see to that parents or visitors are not made to wait unnecessarily for long time and purpose and purpose of their visit is fulfilled.
- 6. They should follow proper dress code inside the college campus.
- 7. Non teaching staff are expected to follow highest level of professional, personal and business ethics within the college.
- 8. Cleanliness of college and hostel campus should be maintained at all times. littering inside the campus is strictly prohibited and if so it should be immediately cleared.
- 9. Working under the influence of alcohol or any sale, use of alcohol or illegal drugs inside the college or hostel campus are strictly prohibited.
- 10. Personal usage of college equipment, material, vehicle should be avoided.
- 11. Any unlawful harassment or discrimination against students or other staff member prohibited and also is punishable.
- 12. Fighting, talking in loud voice, threatening or causing harm to others, in the work platestally discouraged.

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- 13. Smoking inside the campus is strictly not allowed.

RULES FOR STUDENTS

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Students must maintain strict discipline inside the college and hostel premises.
- 2. Students must wear college ID card inside the campus during working hours.
- 3. All students must wear white over coat during working hours.
- 4. All students must follow the instruction given by teaching staffs and shall always interact them with due respect.
- 5. As per Dr.MGR Medical University guidelines 75 percentage of college attendance is compulsory for all theory, practical and clinical classes. students will not be allowed for their university exams, without the required attendance percentage.
- 6. Students must complete the necessary quota of clinical and practical work and exercises within the given time period. Failing which they may not be eligible to appear for the university examinations.
- 7. ragging is strictly prohibited in any form in the college and hostel premises.
- 8. students should strictly adhere to the timings of classes. coming late to theory, practicular classes are not entertained under any circumstances.
- 9. Students are expected to keep the college and hostel campus clean.

10. Students should be dressed up according to their dress characteristics.

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- 11. Students are expected to give respect to their higher authorities and other staff members.
- 12. Students should be courteous and kind towards the Patients and Attender's of patients.
- 13. Students should keep a their appointments with patients without fail.
- 14. any violation of college rules, indiscipline behavior, or in sub coordination will result in penalty, suspension or dismissal of the student from the college.
- 15. Damaging the college property and writing on the walls, doors, desks and sitting on the chairs or working tables are strictly prohibited.
- 16. Phone usage within the class room and college campus during the college hours is strictly prohibited. students have to pay the fine of rupees 500 for the first time, rupees 1000 if caught for the second time and if repeated for the third time cell phone will be confiscated.
- 17. Absenting for the lecture classes, practicals and clinical without a valid cause or prior intimation will be viewed seriously.
- 18. Any misconduct by a students, outrside the college campus that is likely to mar the reputation of the institution will be viewed seriously and liable for punishment according to the nature and seriousness of the offence.
- 19. Visiting students are also expected to follow the dress code.
